If a student discloses any abuse that happened to themselves or someone they know and the victim was under 18 years of age at the time of the abuse, it is necessary to report the abuse IF

there is ANY kind of identifying information eg. Where the abuse happened, who the offender was, when the abuse took place. You do not need ALL of this information, but if you have any of this information, you are required to report it. If you are not sure if you are required to report a case of known abuse, you can call the University compliance hotline for advice. Details below.
